Bocieri, John (D-OH)	Limited information indicates that Bocieri is pro-life. Bocieri may vote more consistently pro-life than Regula, but additional information is necessary. Bocieri may have a mixed record on pro-life issues.	Regula (R) (retired) Regula had a mixed record on pro-life issues.
Griffith, Parker (D-AL)	Opposes abortion funding. Unclear of his position on other issues. Griffith may be better than Cramer, but additional information is necessary. Griffith will likely have a mixed record on pro-life issues.	Cramer (D) (retired) Cramer voted pro-life some of the time, but voted for abortion in military facilities.
Jenkins, Lynn (R-KS)	FRC Guide shows opposition to abortion funding, but other internet information indicates that she is “pro-choice.” She is endorsed by the WISH List. Unlike her predecessor, Jenkins may vote pro-life on some issues. Jenkins will likely have a mixed record on pro-life issues.	Boyda (D) (defeated) Boyda voted consistently pro-abortion.
Olson, Pete (R-TX)	Concerned Women for America endorsed. Olson is expected to be a full pickup.	Lampson (D) (defeated) Lampson voted consistently pro-abortion.
Paulsen, Erik (R-MN)	FRC Guide shows opposition to abortion funding and embryo destructive research funding. Paulsen might be a full pickup.	Ramstad (R) (retired) Ramstad voted consistently pro-abortion.
Rooney, Tom (R-FL)	Florida Right to Life PAC endorsed. Rooney is expected to be a full pickup.	Mahoney (D) (defeated) Mahoney voted consistently pro-abortion.
Stivers, Steve (R-OH)	Some information indicates opposition to embryo destructive research funding, but he also reportedly supports “abortion rights” but wants to outlaw “late-term” abortions. Stivers will likely have a mixed record on pro-life issues.	Pryce (R) (retired) Pryce voted mostly pro-abortion.
